Point 7: Redemption Breaks the Power of Sin

Romans 6:14 (NKJV)

"For sin shall not have dominion over you..."

Galatians 5:1 (NKJV)

"Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free..."

Colossians 1:13 (NKJV)

He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love,

Colossians 1:14 (NKJV)

in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

Point 8: Redemption Includes Healing for the Body

1 Peter 2:24 (NKJV)

"...by whose stripes you were healed."

Matthew 8:17 (NKJV)

"...He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses."

Psalm 103:2-3 (NKJV)

"...Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases..."

Point 9: Redemption Includes Freedom from Lack and Poverty

2 Corinthians 8:9 (NKJV) "...though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich."

Galatians 3:13–14 (NKJV) "Christ **has redeemed** us from the curse of the law... that **the blessing** of Abraham **might come**..."

Psalm 34:10 (NKJV) "...those who seek the Lord shall not lack any good thing."

Point 10: Redemption Gives Us Victory Now and Hope (Expectation) for Eternity

1 Corinthians 15:57 (NKJV) "But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Titus 2:14 (NKJV) "...who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed..."

Revelation 5:9–10 (NKJV) "...You were slain, and have redeemed us to God by Your blood..."

Consequences of Adam's Fall

1. Spiritual Death (Separation from God)

Genesis 2:17 (NKJV) "For in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die." This refers first to **spiritual death**—separation from God's presence.

2. Physical Death (Mortality Introduced)

Genesis 3:19 (NKJV) "For dust you are, and to dust you shall return."

Mortality was introduced. Adam and Eve would now experience aging and physical death.

3. Loss of Dominion and Authority

Luke 4:6 (NKJV) (Satan speaking to Jesus)
"All this authority I will give You...for this has been delivered to me."

Adam handed over mankind's God-given authority to Satan by submitting to his deception. This is why Satan is later called "the god of this world" (2 Corinthians 4:4).

4. Cursed Earth and Hardship

Genesis 3:17-18 (NKJV) "Cursed is the ground for your sake...both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you."

Work became toil. Nature became corrupted. Pain, suffering, and decay entered creation.

5. Broken Relationships

a. Man hid from God

Genesis 3:8 (NKJV) And **they heard the sound** of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife **hid themselves from the presence** of the Lord God among the trees of the garden.

b. Blamed others

Genesis 3:12 (NKJV) Then the man said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I ate."

c. Fear entered

Genesis 3:10 (NKJV) So he said, "I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself."

6. Expulsion from Eden

Genesis 3:24 (NKJV) "So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim...to guard the way to the tree of life."

God blocked access to the Tree of Life in Genesis 3 not out of cruelty, but as an act of mercy to prevent Adam and Eve from sealing their fallen state permanently.

7. Man's Eternal Destiny After the Fall (Without Redemption)? Eternal Separation from God (Hell)

Romans 6:23 (NKJV) "For the wages of sin is death..."

Matthew 25:41 (NKJV) "Depart from Me, you cursed, into the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels."

Without redemption, eternal judgment and separation from God in hell would be man's destiny.

1 John 3:8 (NKJV) ...**For this purpose** the Son of God was manifested, that **He might destroy** the **works** of the devil.

Galatians 3:13 (NKJV) Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"), Galatians 3:14 (NKJV) that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in

Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

Ephesians 1:7 (NKJV) "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace."

Redemption brings us into a family relationship, not just a legal status.

Ephesians 2:13 (NKJV) "But **now in Christ Jesus** you who **once were far off** have been **brought near** by the **blood of Christ**."

Colossians 1:21-22 (NKJV) "And you, who once were alienated... He has reconciled..."

Romans 5:10 (NKJV) "...we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son..."
