

8: Redemption Includes Healing for the Body

1 Peter 2:24 (NKJV) “...by whose stripes **you were healed.**”

Matthew 8:17 (NKJV) “...**He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses.**”

Psalms 103:2–3 (NKJV) “...Who **forgives all** your iniquities, Who **heals all** your diseases...”

“**The Lord will strike you**” Permissive not causative tense. Many respected Hebrew scholars and theologians (such as Dr. Robert Young of *Young’s Analytical Concordance*) have noted that **Hebrew verbs often use the active voice for actions that God merely permits**, not causes.

9: Redemption Includes Freedom from Lack and Poverty

2 Corinthians 8:9 (NKJV) “...though **He was rich**, yet **for your sakes He became poor**, that **you through His poverty might become rich.**”

Galatians 3:13–14 (NKJV) “Christ **has redeemed** us from the curse of the law... that the **blessing of Abraham might come...**”

Psalms 34:10 (NKJV) “...those **who seek** the Lord **shall not lack any good thing.**”

Lack is not your destiny. God’s redemptive plan includes provision to fulfill your purpose and bless others.

10: Redemption Gives Us Victory Now and Hope for Eternity

1 Corinthians 15:57 (NKJV) “But thanks be to God, who **gives us the victory** through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Titus 2:14 (NKJV) “...who **gave Himself for us**, that **He might redeem us from every lawless deed...**”

Revelation 5:9–10 (NKJV) “...**You were slain**, and have **redeemed us to God** by Your blood...”

Redemption doesn’t just impact our past—it changes our future.



Redeemed – Part 2 - An Overview of God’s Rescue Plan

Galatians 3:13 (NKJV) Christ **has redeemed us from the curse** of the law, having **become a curse for us** (for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree”), **Galatians 3:14 (NKJV)** that the **blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus**, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

1: God’s Original Plan Was Fellowship and Dominion

Genesis 1:26 (NKJV) “Then God said, ‘Let Us make man in **Our image**, according to **Our likeness**; let them **have dominion...**’”

Genesis 2:15 (NKJV) “Then the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to **tend and keep it.**”

Genesis 3:8 (NKJV) And **they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden** in the cool of the day, and **Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God** among the trees of the garden.

Genesis 5:24 (NKJV) “And **Enoch walked with God**; and he was not, for God took him.”

Genesis 6:9 (NKJV) “Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. **Noah walked with God.**”

Micah 6:8 (NKJV) “He has shown you, O man, what is good; and **what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?**”

Psalms 8:4–6 (NKJV)

“What is man that You are mindful of him... You have **made him to have dominion** over the works of Your hands...”

2: Sin Entered and Brought Separation from God

Genesis 3:6 (NKJV) “So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food... she took of its fruit and ate.”

Isaiah 59:2 (NKJV) “But your iniquities have separated you from your God...”

Romans 5:12 (NKJV) “Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin...”

3: The Fall Brought Spiritual Death, Sickness, and Poverty

Genesis 3:17–19 (NKJV) “Cursed is the ground for your sake... In toil you shall eat of it...”

Romans 6:23 (NKJV) “For the wages of sin is death...”

Deuteronomy 28:15–22 (NKJV) (portions) “Cursed shall you be... The Lord will strike you with consumption...”

“**The Lord will strike you**” Permissive not causative tense. Many respected Hebrew scholars and theologians (such as Dr. Robert Young of *Young’s Analytical Concordance*) have noted that **Hebrew verbs often use the active voice for actions that God merely permits**, not causes.

4: God Immediately Initiated the Plan of Redemption

Genesis 3:15 (NKJV) “And I will put enmity between you and the woman... He shall bruise your head...”

Revelation 13:8 (NKJV) “...the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world.”

Isaiah 53:5 (NKJV) “But He was wounded for our transgressions... and by His stripes we are healed.”

Redemption was not an afterthought. God’s love planned our rescue before the fall occurred. That’s how valuable you are.

5: Jesus Is the Fulfillment of God’s Redemptive Plan

John 3:16 (NKJV) “For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son...”

Galatians 4:4–5 (NKJV) “But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son... to redeem those who were under the law...”

Matthew 1:21 (NKJV) “...you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins.”

6: Redemption Restores Relationship with God

Ephesians 2:13 (NKJV) “But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ.”

Colossians 1:21–22 (NKJV) “And you, who once were alienated... He has reconciled...”

Romans 5:10 (NKJV) “...we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son...”

7: Redemption Breaks the Power of Sin

Romans 6:14 (NKJV) “For sin shall not have dominion over you...”

Galatians 5:1 (NKJV) “Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free...”

Colossians 1:13 (NKJV) He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love,

Colossians 1:14 (NKJV) in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

Redemption doesn’t just forgive sin—it breaks its power over your life. You are no longer a slave to your past.
